### Topsfield Historical Society's Historical Collections Volume XXXIV

A fine addition to the Topsfield Historical Society's Historical Collections will make its debut at the 2009 Strawberry Festival. Volume XXX1V, edited by THS member J. Jan Jansen, joins an impressive line dating back to 1895 when the Volume 1, edited by G. Francis Dow, was published. Ordinarily priced at \$20.00, Volume XXXIV will sell for \$15.00 at the Festival on June 13.

The new volume, on which Jansen worked for a year and a half, contains 20 chapters ranging from "Topsfield and the Civil War" by David Goss; "The Joseph Gould Barn" and "The John B. Kimball Memorial Trust" both by Norman Isler and "The Topsfield Town Hall Clock" by Isler and Robert Winship. Evelyn Fales contributed an article on Topsfield during the Depression and Assistant Principal Donald Doliber added an account of the Masconomet School District.

Volume XXX1V boasts a wonderful collection of photographs from the Historical Society archives and from Jansen's camera. The East Schoolhouse, the interior of the Gould Barn, the Strawberry Festival and the stairway to the Town Hall Clock are featured along with many other images to remind readers of the variety and beauty of Topsfield's past and present. The cover with a handsome image of the Parson Capen House matches those of earlier Collections as well.

The Topsfield Historical Society's charter includes the mandate to "...collect, preserve and study materials relating to the history of the town," and the Historical Collections answer that call perfectly. Volume 1, edited by Dow, contains an article about Anne Bradstreet by Metta Bradstreet as well as an article by Abbie W. Towne about William Towne and his daughters (three of whom were accused of witchcraft in 1692 and two of whom were hanged.) In Volume XXV Dow writes about "Coins Our Fathers Used" and Volume XXX11 (1974) contains a vivid portrait of Thomas Proctor by C. Lawrence Bond and a map of Proctor's land. The Collections can be found in the Topsfield Room at the Library.

In addition to brief biographies, many of the Collections also contain useful statistics: baptismal records, lists of family members (including in Volume V111 the Smith family and son Joseph, the first president of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints), lists of town officers and chronologies of Topsfield events. In short, The Topsfield Historical Society Historical Collections are a rich source of information for researchers and anyone interested in the events and flavor of the town. Volume XXX1V continues an invaluable tradition.
